

News from Guidance

I enjoyed talking, interacting and meeting with the students during the classroom guidance lessons on the following Virtues-Knowledge, Respect, Simplicity, and Forgiveness. The students in all grade levels played an active part in the different activities and lessons.

EC3-EC4- The books I read were about how to treat our friends in the classroom like family, showing what respect to our friends and the people we love looks like, caring about ourselves and others, saying sorry when we hurt the feelings of others and forgiving others when they say things that make us sad. They had questions and wanted to share their personal stories and memories. It was really nice to see how they were able to relate to the stories from the books I read to them.

KG, 1st and 2nd-They were so engaged as I read the various books to them. They always have such interesting comments and conversations when it is time to ask/answer questions and share. They had coloring sheets and writing activities regarding Bee-ing Respectful. They shared stories of times when they made good choices. We talked about forgiveness and what to do when we hurt others with the things we say and/or do. The Golden Rule was mentioned as well.

3rd, 4th and 5th- The students had to write their goal for this year. We had a discussion about establishing a place to complete their homework, using their planners and turning in all of their assignments in on time. Respect- the meaning of it, how to demonstrate it with your words and your actions at school and at home. Psalms 23:1 was a coloring sheet they enjoyed for fun. Saying sorry and asking for forgiveness is sometimes hard for some people to do but it is the right thing to do. We talked about what it really means to forgive and how to do that. They were given examples of different responses to use when someone apologizes to them. They could say" I forgive you", or "I do not forgive you." Do not say" it's ok". By saying it's ok the person may not take your emotions seriously and hurt you again.
