REGISTRATION AND RE-REGISTRATION

Our in-person **Registration Day for New Students** will take place in the school gym this coming **Monday, January 12th from 8:15-3:00 p.m.** New families will be expected to complete the application at this time. Please be prepared to present the following documents at the time of registration: *child's original birth certificate, baptismal certificate, health records (immunization form and physical are required before July 31, 2026)*.

Registration for returning students will also begin on Monday, January 12th. This application will be completed on RenWeb. Please check your current RenWeb information for any address, contact information or medical information that may have changed since the last registration. **All registration must be completed by February 12, 2026.** If your child will not be returning to St. Paul's for the 2026-2027 academic year, please contact the school office ASAP so that we can offer the seat to another child. As always, we expect to have wait lists in most of the grades. Financial assistance for students in grades K-8 is available through the Mary C Forbes Foundation, Parish Assistance, and the Diocese FACTS Grant, for families who qualify. REMINDERS



On **Monday, January 12th**, students in grades K-8 will be taking the **MAP (Measures of Academic Progress)** tests. MAP is a computer-based assessment that helps teachers understand each student's academic growth in **reading and mathematics**. The results allow teachers to identify students' strengths, areas for growth, and guide instruction to better meet individual learning needs. MAP is not a graded test; rather, it is a tool used to support student learning and growth over time.
